Project Description

The First edition has been published in 2018 and is available on the AMDIN website. A call for papers for the next edition has also been published.

AMDIN decided to create a unique journal for Africa at which representatives of AMDIN, the African Union (AU) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) will participate. The EU, and NSG as the Secretariate to AMDIN, is supporting the development of the Journal given the unique niche that the journal is aiming to fill within the Continent.
