## **Key Achievements of the outgoing Secretary-General**

- Successfully convened AMDIN General Assemblies (2021 & 2024) & facilitated EXCO elections.
- Led the conversion of the AU's African Charter into an online training programme accessible to all public servants in Africa.
- Oversaw the successful rollout of Project Khaedu (frontline service delivery model) across all
  5 AMDIN regions.
- Hosted AMDIN's 1st continental Economic Governance School in 2022, followed by programmes in Kenya, Zambia & Ghana.
- Organised webinars and virtual training with partners such as the China Africa Institute & ALSF on the AfCFTA and sustainable mining governance.
- Reintegrated higher education institutions into AMDIN.
- Hosted the inaugural African Conference on Public Affairs & Development in Ghana in 2025.
- Launched the Africa Journal of Public Sector Development and Governance (AJPSDG), an open-access publication with global reach.
- Reduced annual AMDIN membership fees from \$3 000 to \$1 000 to increase access.
- Advanced the African Governance postgraduate diploma, incl. curriculum review to be offered by Tshwane University of Technology.
- Expanded AMDIN's network with new members from Morocco, DRC, Ethiopia, Somalia and
